Dear Mister Secretary:

The Citizens Coinage Advisory Committee (CCAC) held a public meeting on November 18, 2025, during which the CCAC reviewed the candidate designs for the 2027–2030 Youth American Sports Quarters George Washington obverse. The *Circulating Collectible Coin Redesign Act* (Act) (Public Law 116–330) directs the Secretary of the Treasury to redesign and issue quarter dollar coins each year from 2027 to 2030. The reverse of each quarter dollar must be “emblematic of sports played by American youth.”

For the obverse, the Act requires: “...the quarter dollars shall maintain a likeness of George Washington and be designed in a manner so as to distinguish it from the obverse design used during the previous quarter dollars program.” The previous program, in this case, is the American Women Quarters Program.

At our public meeting, the CCAC reviewed the portfolio and following a robust discussion scored the candidate designs with the obverse **GW-01** receiving the highest score (20 out of 30 possible points). By a motion that passed by voice vote with nine in favor and one abstaining, the CCAC recommends this candidate design. It should be noted that the CCAC felt that this candidate design paired well with the 2027–2030 John F. Kennedy half dollar observe **JFK-02** also recommended by the CCAC at the same meeting (see separate letter).

It is an honor to serve as the Chair of the CCAC and I am proud of the CCAC’s role in the production of United States coins and medals.
