Dear Mister Secretary:

The Citizens Coinage Advisory Committee (CCAC) held a public meeting on November 18, 2025, during which the CCAC reviewed the candidate designs for the 2028 Native American \$1 Coin Program that honors Native Americans and celebrates the important contributions made by Indian tribes and individual Native Americans to the development and history of the United States. The obverse of the coins retains the depiction of Sacagawea and her infant son, first used in 2000 on the Sacagawea Golden Dollar Coin. In 2028, the reverse will recognize the Native Hawaiian contribution of He'e Nalu, also known as surfing. He'e Nalu is deeply rooted in Native Hawaiian culture and history. For centuries, Hawaiians practiced it as a favored pastime, demonstrating their physical prowess and mastery of the waves. Today, this Pacific sport has evolved into a global industry while retaining its profound cultural heritage and reverence for the ocean.

At our public meeting, the CCAC reviewed the portfolio and following discussion scored the candidate designs with the reverse **28NA-2** receiving the highest score (20 out of 30 possible points). By a motion that passed unanimously by voice vote, the CCAC recommends this candidate design.

It is an honor to serve as the Chair of the CCAC and I am proud of the CCAC's role in the production of United States coins and medals.
